Cambodia is at the beginning of the rainy season. The orange color of the dry season is giving way to green as the rice fields get the nutrients from the rain and very soon the lakes and rivers will be full of life.

During the last few months several things have happened that we want to share with you, because without you they would not have been possible.



APRIL

*The 9th of April, 2012 Father Albeiro, Vice-rector Don Bosco and a group of his young adults went with TFC management to visit a group of vulnerable children with birth physical disabilities. We made an evaluation of the kind of support these children need and created a child sponsor programme. We sought the advice of some foreign doctors resident in Cambodia, and Together for Cambodia will be seeking help to get special surgery for children with Meningocele, (a disease of the cerebrospinal fluid in cranial cavities, which requires surgery to reduce the volume).



*The 11th of April, Father Albeiro and a group of young adults came to our centre to speak to our teenagers and young adults about the Don Bosco Technical School, the gallery of studies, and the different programmes that they offer. The goal of these discussions was to open our young adults' minds to the kinds of possibilities open to them for their future. Some of our adolescents were very impressed and actually are thinking about the opportunities discussed with them.

*In the middle of April, the Real Madrid Foundation published in its Facebook Fan page a letter about our football team!!! THANK YOU very much to this Foundation for the donation of a complete set of football uniforms. Your kindness and your help and attention have been incredible for the children of TFC.



*The 13th, 14th and 15th of April was Khmer New Year. Around 30 children went to visit the communities that they are originally from. Another group of 10 children stayed at home and enjoyed being involved in many activities. We went to the pagoda of our community to offer food to the monks and to get their blessings. We also went to the Piunllu Park, to the Phonm Kullen waterfalls and to the Cultural Village. These were “family” days, full of traditional events, funny and unforgettable moments!!! *The 18th of April we moved the wood-bamboo house from Treak to the Children’s House.



MAY

*At the beginning of May it was re-built on the property, giving us more accommodation room for our Centre. The three rooms have been transformed to: 1-Visitor. 2-First Aid. 3-Counselling. We are now in the process of finishing the set up and furnishing of the rooms.



We are very thankful to the benefactor J.V.D. from Holland, for covering the cost of the move and reconstruction of the building and to the Curves Gym ladies, friends of V.S., from Christchurch New Zealand, for the furniture and all kind of accessories needed for the rooms.

**We have installed basketball equipments and painted different areas creating a playground atmosphere all around the house with local and international games, also thanks to the Curves Gym ladies.



***At the end of May we celebrated our BIRTHDAY PARTY FOR ALL. We had a party organized by the kids, with homemade hot dogs, salads, music, dance, karaoke and of course a wonderful cake. They all deserved such a treat!



****The 27th of May, in Madrid, our Benefactor Carmen C. and her family, inaugurated a project developed by her to fundraise for TFC by selling golf balls in different provinces in Spain. Thank you very much for this brilliant initiative and for all the enthusiastic interest and love you have for this life project.



JUNE

*The 1st of June, we celebrated Children's International Day. We were invited, with other twenty or more organizations, to celebrate this day together with the Social Affairs Department in Siem Reap. There were different activities, speeches from the local authorities even from our Director, Ouk Piseth. He wrote his speech about the rights of vulnerable children and about the importance of protecting the more vulnerable people like children and women living at risk. In our home, we have developed an assembly to discuss children's rights. Our children are very concerned to have basic rights for all such as: Education, Food, Home, Play games, Protection, Freedom to speak and express opinions and no discrimination.



**The 9th of June at 7.30pm was the performance of Chorus MIL CAMINOS (ONE THOUSAND WAYS) in Alcobendas-Madrid. The entrance was for free and everybody donated according their means for TOGETHER FOR CAMBODIA. Gregorian chants, Mantras and Classical Polyphony were performed; it was an exciting evening with a lot of applause. I'm very thankful to the Chorus Mil Caminos for their efforts in organizing this concert. One of the people attending the concert wrote: "The room was nearly full, the energy transmitted and the human warmth and passion when singing created a very special atmosphere. 


**** On June 24th, we went to the CSC, Children's Surgery Center in Phnom Penh, with two children from a community in Siem Reap. L. 10 years old and S. 6 years old were infected with naso meningocele and were accepted for surgery. Together with their parents, the Social Worker of TFC and the children, we went to the capital city looking for a better life for these children. The waiting time was very long, because cases were arriving from all around the country, children, young adults and adults with terrible malfunctions deriving from this sickness. In many cases this condition brings deafness, blindness and paralysis of the legs ... The sickness can be caused by genetic issues, mal nutrition and environmental factors.

After checking both children, and looking at the day's priorities, with dozens of cases that looked very bad, the doctors decided to do L's surgery in November 2012. For S. the situation looked different and they decided to do eye surgery because he is blind in one eye caused by this sickness.



**** The 28th of June saw the grand opening for the Photographic Exhibition on Cambodia, it's past, present and future, by Marcos Domingo Sánchez. *During the months of April, May and June we have sent some staff to different training programmes related to the Care and Protection of the Children, as follows:



-CONCERT Child Protection Induction Training for Volunteers.

**During the months of April, May and June 2012, a total of 15 children went to the Health Centre Angkor Hospital for Children, the most common illnesses were: stomach ache; eye problems; pharyngitis; fever, sore throat and cough and one child got dengue fever.

***We improved our transport with the incorporation of a motorbike. This is very useful as we don't need driver. It gives independence to our staff when they have to attend training, meetings, or to visit other places. Thank you to the family M.K. from Australia who made this possible and the improvement of our library too.



****Our FOOD For The SOUL cookbook is distributed all around Australia. Michael Kramer, from Brisbane, organized the publication and the distribution of the book in Spotlight stores across Australia and it is selling very well. We can arrange to have book sent to you let me know.
